## **A. Tournament Format**

Tournament Format is outlined in the Ringette Canada Technical Package. The Technical Package and Schedule will be determined by Ringette Canada and circulated as soon as it is made available.

## **B. Rosters**

Teams are not able to pick up additional players. For the purposes of the Canadian Ringette Championships, any players on your roster as affiliate players will be considered as full roster players and may attend the CRCs with your team. Players may only be listed on one (1) CRC roster as a player.

## **C. Regulations for Players**

Possession or use of alcohol is restricted. Team staff are required to discourage the use of alcohol and have the authority to restrict legal age players from consuming alcohol.

Possession of any substance prohibited by any Federal or Provincial law is prohibited.

Use of tobacco is prohibited while in uniform and/or outside of the arena in which the tournament is taking place. Team staff have the authority to further restrict the use of cigarettes.

Any misconduct could result in, but is not limited to, one or more of the following:

- a) Disqualification from the National Championship for one year
- b) Further suspension by Ringette Alberta
- c) Prosecution by law
- d) Fine
- e) In the case of illegal drug use, suspension or banishment from Ringette Alberta

Failure to abide by the Code of Conduct may be cause for disciplinary action by Ringette Alberta or Ringette Canada against individual players, coaches or organizers.

## **D. Coaching Staff**

All coaches are required to be Competition Introduction Certified (CI #1 and CI #2) or Level 2 (old NCCP) certified and have completed the Make Ethical Decisions Evaluation.

*Ringette Canada has announced their new Professional Development program for the Canadian Ringette Championships, starting with the 2018 CRCs in Winnipeg, Manitoba. All coaches that have completed their Competition Introduction Certifications (evaluation) prior to May 2017 and will be coaching at the 2018 Canadian Ringette Championships, will be required to complete ONE Competition Development Multi-Sport Module. These modules include: Developing Athletic Abilities, Coaching and Leading Effectively, Prevention and Recovery, Managing Conflict, Leading a Drug-Free Sport, and Psychology of Performance. The manager is required to have taken Ringette Canada's Manager Certification Program, however, managers will not be permitted on the bench.

The trainer must have valid First Aid and CPR and must provide Ringette Alberta with a copy of their most current certificate.

As per Ringette Canada policy, all U16 and U19 teams must have a fully certified female head or assistant coach, 18 years or older on the bench. Please note, having a female trainer on the bench and no coach is not sufficient. If the female coach is also a player in the Canadian Ringette Championships, she will be excused only during playing time (including sufficient travel time).

There will be a maximum of five team staff on the bench for any given game.

Ringette Alberta team rosters are finalized as of January 31 of the current playing season. These approved team staff members are the only individuals allowed to occupy the bench and playing area.

#### **E. On-Ice Apparel**

Ringette Alberta will not be providing any on-ice apparel to club teams. Each team is required to have two sets of jerseys. As this year's CRCs will feature both provincial teams and club teams, the following uniform policies will be in place:

- Provincial team vs. club team - If there is a jersey colour conflict, the club team will change
- Provincial team vs. Provincial team - if there is a jersey colour conflict, the visiting team will change
- Club team vs. club team - if there is a jersey colour conflict, the visiting team will change

#### **F. Off-Ice Apparel**

Teams are expected to have a matching "walk out" uniform for Opening Ceremonies. Please use good judgment in selecting your team's walk out uniform.

#### **G. Accommodations**

Accommodations are the responsibility of the team, contact the Host Committee to see if they are rooms blocked off for the tournament.
