14. Rule No. *

- MISCONDUCT - 16.1.a - A Misconduct penalty is committed if a player or team staff uses language or makes gestures that are obscene, profane, or abusive toward any person.
- MISCONDUCT - 16.1.b - A Misconduct penalty is committed if a player or team staff member persists in disputing, or shows disrespect for, the ruling of an on-ice official.
- MISCONDUCT - 16.1.c - A Misconduct penalty is committed if a team staff member steps onto the ice during the game, except in the case of a player injury.
- MATCH 18.1.a - A Match penalty is committed if a player or a team staff member commits a penalty infraction with intent to injure.
- MATCH 18.1.b - A Match penalty is committed if a player or a team staff member fights
- MATCH 18.1.c - A Match penalty is committed if a player or a team staff member intentionally spears, butt-ends, or kicks an opponent
- MATCH 18.1.d (1)- A Match penalty is committed if a player or a team staff member excessively abuses an on-ice official before, during, or immediately after a game. Such actions against the on-ice officials include, but are not limited to intentional touching, holding, or pushing
- MATCH 18.1.d (2) - A Match penalty is committed if a player or a team staff member excessively abuses an on-ice official before, during, or immediately after a game. Such actions against the on-ice officials include, but are not limited to 18.1.d (2) intentionally striking, tripping, or body checking
- MATCH 18.1.d (3) - A Match penalty is committed if a player or a team staff member excessively abuses an on-ice official before, during, or immediately after a game. Such actions against the on-ice officials include, but are not limited to threatening or attempting to strike
- MATCH 18.1.d (4) - A Match penalty is committed if a player or a team staff member excessively abuses an on-ice official before, during, or immediately after a game. Such actions against the on-ice officials include, but are not limited to persisting in actions for which a Misconduct penalty has been assessed.
- MATCH 18.1.e - A Match penalty is committed if a player or a team staff member intentionally leaves the penalty bench or the players' bench during an altercation and specifically becomes involved in the altercation.

MATCH 18.1.f - A Match penalty is committed if a player or a team staff member commits a boarding, body contact, charging, cross-checking or elbowing infraction with initial contact from behind which propels their opponent directly into the boards, goal post or cross bar, in such a way that the player is unable to protect or defend herself by raising her arms or hands or adjusting body position to brace for impact.
